John Chapter 2 Verses 1-11

Has it ever struck you that this is the first miracle Jesus performed during His ministry on earth?! He didn't save dying children, heal the life long sick or forgive innumerable sins. 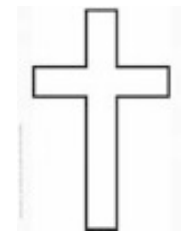
